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## Trio of special events highlight Rogue Winterfest

Tickets on sale for festival, which begins Dec. 5

Tickets are now on sale for three special events that are part of the 11th annual Rogue Winterfest, scheduled for Dec. 5 through 9 at the Bear Hotel.

The festival showcases 25 beautifully decorated trees and one-of-a-kind art pieces designed by local artists and designers, displayed in a winter wonderland setting surrounded by lights.

Two days of the five-day event, Dec. 7 and 8, are set aside for public viewings. Those tickets are sold at the door only.

The festival's three special events are the Gala and Holiday Auction on Dec. 5, the Golden Social on Dec. 6, and the Culinary Christmas Classic on Dec.

"Ticket sales are going really well so far," says event planner Sue Price. "We're about 75 percent sold out on the culinary event and the gala is about 50 percent sold."

Tickets are \$45 and guests must be 21 or older to attend.
